A5 Portaledges used worldwide

A5 Portaledges have been used on the cutting edge of extreme Grade VI ascents worldwide. Our strong and light single (one person), and double (two person) portaledges have been used on difficult multi-day vertical ascents in Alaska, Antarctica, Africa, Baffin Island, Indian Himalaya, Pakistan Karakoram, Patagonia, and many other areas, including Zion, Yosemite, the Wind Rivers. the Black Canvon of the Gunnison, and the Chamonix Alps. A5 portaledges have been tested in the most extreme conditions; Mugs Stump and Conrad

Anker spent 8 days and nights in their double ledge during a storm on the Eye Tooth in the Alaska range, and Greg Child and Mark Wilford report about being hammered by icefall during a three day storm on Trango with zero damage to their ledge and rainfly. The A5 Double Ledge and standard rainfly was used by John Middendorf and Xaver Bongard on the first ascent of The Grand Voyage, a 4400 vertical big-wall route on the Great Trango Tower in Pakistan, a route which was climbed in an 18 day push and which really tested the limits of survival on the vertical. Ascents which were once thought impossible considering the likelihood of extreme weather conditions are now comfortably survivable with A5 hanging bivouac shelter technology.

Compact and easy to set up.

A5 portaledges fit compactly in their own haulbag and can be set up anywhere, requiring only a single anchor point. Setup takes less than a minute and is a breeze thanks to A5's exclusive "fold-over bed tensioning system", in which the frame is assembled first, followed by tensioning the bed. Comfort is unsurpassed in A5 portaledges. The beds are constructed of tough nylon packcloth with ballistics scuffguards at the wear points.

Engineered Quality

A5 portaledge frames are constructed of 6061 aircraft aluminum tubing and precision machined corners. Close tolerances ensure fast setup and disassembly. Lightweight and strong, the A5 frames are exceptionally rigid, and are designed to eliminate twisting and hourglassing. A5 portaledges are "bomber" in situations that would crumple any other design.

Rainflys built to last

Our standard rainflys are constructed of urethane coated oxford nylon and a full length ballistics nylon scuffguard. Unlike other products, our flys feature only a

single vertical seam for maximum waterproofness. With proper seam sealing, the oxford nylon on our standard flys can withstand the most severe storms. A double drawstring closure and tensioning straps on the

inside corners seal the fly to the ledge. An integrated stuffsack system allows for ultimate preparedness during times of weather, because the fly can be clipped into the suspension ready to deploy at any time.





Tips for sealing Portaledge Rainflys:

Sealing with regular seam sealer is a joke for conditions found on big walls. Instead, use McNett Corporation's AquasealTM or Seamgrip TM (for sealing wet suits, found in scuba diving shops), or a similar urethane product, like ShoePatch (Shoegoo is a bit too thick).

A5 Haulbags have proven their toughness and durability on extreme big-wall ascents around the world. Constructed of the tough vinyl coated fabric which is famous for

its durability, frictionless hauling, and waterproofness. Our haulbags have been known to survive unharmed after 2000 foot plummets from the top of a wall, fully packed and tossed. A5 Haulbags feature an



offset four-point suspension with carabiner clipped access, and full length 2" wide straps which run along the sides and bottom. All seams are protected from abrasion including the shoulder straps and bottom seam which have their own scuffguards. A full strength clip-in loop for securing the haulbag at belays is integrated into the suspension. A packcloth skirt and external drawstring closure seal the bag tight and give it a streamlined bullet shape for hauling. Carrying loads to the base is no problem with our fully padded suspension system: the padded waist belt is removable, and the integral padded shoulder straps tuck inside their own pocket quickly for easy access and snag-free hauling. An inside zippered pocket keeps small items accessible. A5 Haulbags have 10,000 cu. in. capacity.

ascents where huge racks must be organized, the A5 Haulpack can be the gear bag, with separate slings of pitons, camming devices, mashheads, hooks, etc. suspended from the hauling point: the haulpack acts as a protective sheath for the

racks, while allowing easy access to medium sized items in the bottom of the pack.












Mount Asgard North Tower Valkyrie VI,A4+

User Fees vs. Climber's Responsibility by John Govi

Recently while climbing in Zion, I became aware of the attraction my partner and I were to the people below. At least ten different people had binoculars on us. Park rangers, who apparently knew something about climbing, were present. I could see them gesturing with their hands, obviously explaining how we climbed to the onlookers.

Attention directed toward climbers from the general public and park officials is inevitable because there are many more climbers now than there used to be. Unfortunately, the potential implications of this are user fees, and the requirement of climbers paying a fee on the premise of covering rescue costs. This is already a reality in Denali National Park.

What should we do about this new situation? Most obviously, keep the cliffs clean and never throw garbage down. Avoid crowded routes which can create a dangerous situation. Be prepared to sit out bad weather and always plan to move up or down self sufficiently. Now more than ever, we need to climb with a low impact, professional approach. Otherwise, the noble character of big wall climbing and its freedoms may be lost.
